



DUAL ENROLLMENT

Dual enrollment is an acceleration program that allows students to take postsecondary (college) coursework and simultaneously earn credit toward a high school diploma, a career certificate, an industry certification or an associate or baccalaureate degree at an eligible Florida postsecondary institution.



 - ACT | 28
- Spring 2024
 - Application Open Now
 - Application Closes | November 1

- 11th 12th grade students only
- GPA | 3.6
- Max 2 UF Online DE courses per semester
- Meet qualifying SAT/ACT composite, or PSAT test scores.
 - SAT | 1100
 - ACT | 22
 - PSAT | 1130
- Spring 2024
 - Application Opens | September 21
 - Application Closes | October 30





VALENCIA COLLEGE

- GPA | 3.0 unweighted: 3.0 weighted for Seniors
- Fall and Spring | 4 courses (13 credit hours)
- Summer | 2 courses (7 credit hours)
 - Flex term classes are not permitted for Fall and Spring terms;
 only in Summer for continuing DE students
- Meet qualifying official SAT, ACT, or PERT scores.
 - <u>Click for test requirement information</u>
- Valencia DE Virtual Info Session
 - Wed, October 4, 2023 | 6:00 7:00 pm → Register
- Spring 2024 Dates
 - Application Open | September 11
 - Application Closes | October 11
 - Assessment Score Deadline | November 9
- Under 16 must be accompanied by an adult to campus

REMEMBER

- Dual Enrollment Student are allowed 1 withdrawal to maintain eligibility.
- <u>DROP</u> allows students to remove courses from their schedule without penalty if they do so prior to the drop deadline.
- <u>WITHDRAWALS</u> remain on the student's college transcript and count against their withdrawal allotment for Dual Enrollment participation.
- Protecting the student's college GPA is extremely important
- Students should have a plan for DE coursework that aligns with their post-secondary goals

FAQ'S

Can I satisfy all of my HS Requirements in DE?

Most high school requirements can be satisfied, with the exception of Algebra 1,
 Geometry and the Physical Education Requirement.

• Does it help a student get admission to UF/UCF if they take DE there?

No. Where a student takes DE coursework has no bearing on their college admission
 opportunity.

• If I continue at Valencia after graduating from high school, do I have to re-apply?

 No, but students will be required to submit the following: FAFSA, Florida residency forms, and a final official high school transcript with your graduation date by the appropriate deadlines in order to register for courses as a degree-seeking student.





TAKE 5 ACADEMIC SUBJECTS EVERY YEAR

 "Students who want to be competitive with selective and highly selective colleges should take five solid academic subjects a year in English, math, social studies, science and foreign language." (Princeton Review)

• MATH + ENGLISH ALL 4 YEARS

- "Students who take math in each year of high school are far more successful in college than students taking only three years." (NACAC)
- 63% of 2023 FSU EA admits had some form of "Advanced Math" coursework. 12% increase FY 2023

FOREIGN LANGUAGE

- At least 2 years of **sequential** language
 - More than just 2 years, choose other FL
- FSU 2023 average = 3.5 years
- Dual Enrollment sequencing conflict

DON'T....


- Move from AP/DE to Hon/Regular
 - Why would a student take college level English and then 10th grade English?
 - Exceptions/changes will need to be explained on applications.
- Drop Academic Elective to General (PE, art, etc.)
- Drop a Core Course because the Student has Met a Graduation Requirement.
- DE: AA Degree MUST Align with Post
 Secondary Goals This is not a race!




